The Meeting was called to order 9:00.

REVIEW OF PREVIOUS MINUTES The Minutes of the January 12, 2021 Meeting were reviewed and approved.

SERVICE DIRECTOR REPORT

- Resident branch pickup is now complete, and will resume as scheduled in the spring.
- One of the storm water sump pumps at the Village Hall failed and was replaced by the Service Department. The redundant backup pump continued to function, and the alarm installed after the last failure put us on notice, avoiding catastrophe.
- Last Friday, we began receiving delivery for ordered salt, but was advised that further deliveries might be delayed because of a strike at the loading yard. We presently have about 150 tons stored. 125 tons are left to be delivered after the strike.
- The small yellow truck had an engine fire, putting it out of service until the insurance claim is completed and a decision can be made whether to repair or replace. A rough estimate of what it would cost to replace the truck would be between \$110,000-150,000.

CHIEF'S REPORT

- The effort to recruit additional part time officers continues. There is a smaller pool of qualified applicants, because fewer people are going into law enforcement.
- PPE provisions are in good supply

OLD BUSINESS

- Update on 911 Cellular database and discussion of CODE RED.

NEW BUSINESS

- Discussion of Annual Asset Review update for Police and Service Department
- Discussion of review of Procedural Manuals for Administration and Police Departments
- Discussion of how to best address road hazards caused by ice on residential roads. Residents will be encouraged to call the Police Duty Phones to reports dangerous conditions in real time, to that the Service Department can respond quickly. Otherwise, the Service Department plows and salts county roads as first priority, and then patrols residential streets. The question of whether the particular hazard of the curve at 55 and 65 Grey Fox Run might be ameliorated by engineering changes will be discussed with the Village Engineer.
