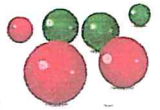

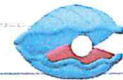

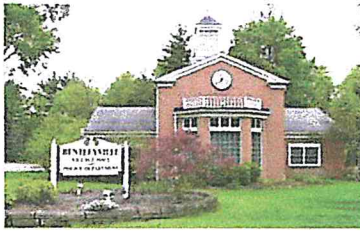

Chemical or Pesticide Pick-Up:

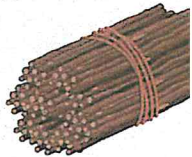
Call Village Hall (440) 247-5055 to arrange pick-up from your home.

Branch Pick-Up:

The Service Department is pleased to again offer branch pickup starting on May 15, 2020 and ending October 1, 2020. Bentleyville is one of only a few remaining jurisdictions that continue to offer this service for its residents.

- Place piles of branches at the curb with the base of all branches facing in one direction.
- Branches should be 5' or less in length and no heavier than one person can lift.

Due to limitations on staffing resources and branch/yard waste disposal costs incurred by the Village the branch pickup program is designed for small to medium residential projects. Should your project be of a larger scope to include the removal of whole trees or multiple large bushes/shrubbery, please make alternate arrangements with your landscaper or tree service to remove the debris from your property.
