Minutes: Updates from Ryan

- 1. Repair on Freightliner- needs regeneration. Time to repair unknown
- 2. Plowing with the Ford 550s can handle the load. 1 plow running. Liberty Ford is fixing the heat on others that should be under warranty.
- 3. Freightliner will hold enough salt to do the entire community.
- 4. Service Employee search
 - -Anthony doing well, but needs to learn
 - -Posted the second job: Maybe on LN? Discuss at the Council meeting
 - -Looking for a stable employee
- 5. Park lights have been on at night. Need to be monitored. Chief advised
- 6. Tank purchase- down to one option. Ryan continues to source other used options
- 7. Fuel is being delivered today. The budget is being amended at the Council meeting on 11/16 to accommodate the need for additional fuel purchases through the end of the year.

Agenda items:

Holiday Lighting Ceremony on Sunday 11/27 (6:30 pm) approx. 80 people

- 1. The garden club is decorating
- 2. The lighting of the Tree outside of the village hall needs to be relit
- 3. Santa is all set, Ken took care of it
- 4. Confirm with Garden Club that snacks and cookies will be provided to serve approx. 80 people
- 5. Purchase candy canes by 11/16, and submit the receipt to Nikki
- 6. The electrical issue in the courtyard outside the chief's office may cause challenges with lighting shrubs.
- 7. Place Signs up at the corner of Village Hall

The state has provided 100K for park improvement which is being proposed to be used for asphalt and a bathroom in Bentleyville Park. The total cost of the project is estimated to be between 137-147K. The key questions/issues are below:

- 1. Do we want to spend an additional 37k+ to improve the park?
- 2. If we end up having to relocate the service garage due in 3 years to the park, will the value of the park change both in terms of total value and perceived value to residents?

- 3. Do Bentleyville residents value the park enough to want a bathroom? The cost to maintain the bathroom was not discussed or accounted for in the proposed budget.
- 4. Should the impending issue with the Metroparks and our service department influence spending the money on a bathroom/asphalt improvement?

We discussed collecting additional information regarding the service garage and the park prior to further discussions of the use of the grant.
