Chief Barone explained that with department approval vacation could carry from one year to the next however similar language did not exist for holidays and this ordinance would allow carryover of up to 24 hours.

Chief Barone also explained that the interpretation in the past was that the uniform allowance has always been paid in July based upon the prior year and prorated if an employee started after July. The problem is that anyone starting full time does not get any allowance to use going forward. This ordinance would allow for the full uniform allowance of \$700, plus any prorated allowance to be paid. Discussion ensued. The law director explained that we should be looking prospectively, not retrospectively for full-

time. Mr. Kvacek noted that adjustments have been made on an individual basis in the past. The Chief was concerned that it would become a problem with a new officer that has nothing. Discussion and suggestions began. It was decided to table the ordinance and make a few changes. Mr. Kvacek suggested a clawback if an employee leaves before a year of employment. Mr. Nemer suggested prorating the amount for new hires before July 1st in addition to a \$700 allowance. They would have to work 12 months before the next \$700 allowance and would have a prorated clawback if they left within the first twelve months. No penalties would be charged after the first year of employment.

The Mayor noted that the final part of the ordinance is to eliminate the auxiliary unit. This was passed many years ago in response to staffing issues.
