MAYOR'S REPORT: 0:01:22 Thanks to the Garden Club for the holiday decorations, and everyone who supported and attended the tree lighting ceremony. Attendance was high and everyone seemed to enjoy themselves. Officers visited 170 Grey Fox Run to assist and the residents responded with gratitude and a gift card to Alesci's. Some students from University School made some recommendations as part of their studies requesting a sidewalk on Solon Road. Mr. Goetsch stated that there are challenges with this request. Mr. Filarski said that in order to qualify for funding there would have to be more room and demand for use. Mayor Hale thanked Mr. Filarski for looking into it. Mayor Hale stated her intention is to create a newsletter to send to residents to advise them of among other things the upcoming levy renewals. There is a service that has been used in the past.

CHIEF'S REPORT: 0:12:22 Each year Council evaluates wages and benefits and Chief Barone wanted to be sure to mention how grateful he is for the support. The full-time employees currently are not looking to go elsewhere. The medical benefits are some of the best in the area. Mr. Goetsch agreed that the current personnel is exceptional.

**SERVICE DEPARTMENT REPORT: 0:17:21** Of the 14 hydrants 5 have been replaced by Cleveland Water. The remaining hydrants are in good working order according to the Water department. Mr. Maistros expressed frustration with equipment breaking down. Mr. Goetsch said there was discussion of selling one of the 550 trucks which is not adequate for the work needing to be done on the larger streets and acquiring an additional Freightliner truck. Mayor Hale asked to meet with Mr. Maistros for further information on this topic. Mr. Kvacek said he spoke with both Chagrin and Solon and they had trucks down. Mr. Maistros said the 550's are not sufficient to salt and plow the roads even with a light dusting of snow. Those trucks are not meant to handle spreading salt. Snow ban signs have been sent to Judco for production.

Mr. Kvacek asked about the water line break, and wondered why reverse 911 was not utilized for that instance. Ms. Hale agreed, but there was not enough information given. Mr. Filarski said there would be door to door notification by the Water Department if there was a boil order. Ms. Hale agreed, however there was no information given by the Water Department to pass along.

- Finance, Grants, Insurance Committee Report Pretty close on the budget. A number of meetings and communication with Council. Mr. Kvacek noticed a couple of corrections in the budget, Village hall maintenance, tree planning and landscaping, traffic pole were zeroed out in error. Capital project fund had a negative balance, but the beginning balance did not carry over. Debt Service was also a question, why is there a transfer in from the General Fund which leaves an ending balance of almost enough for another year. Mr. Kvacek suggested not transferring money into the debt service fund. Council was in general agreement. Ms. Most agreed to email the final budget to members of Council. RITA income is good.
